Fall Sunday School Series: "How to Talk Like a Christian (in an election year and beyond)"

It is a truism to say that our society is divided, and the divisions are deep and complex: We separate over modes of self-expression, political preference, deeply-held core values, and, most often, combinations of the three. How should a Christian speak about these things, which matter so much to us? In September and October, let us work together to learn how to engage and how to speak as those who follow Jesus, called to be ambassadors, or friendmakers, for God through Christ and entrusted, not with always winning, but with the ministry of reconciliation.

Fall Book Study: "<u>The Christians as the Romans Saw Them</u>: How the Culture, Religion, and Values of Ancient Rome Viewed and Shaped Early Christians"

Join us at **4:30pm on Wednesdays**—note the new time!—to dive into the classic book *The Christians as the Romans Saw Them*, by Dr. Robert Wilkin. Who were the ancient Romans? How did they really view early Christians? What were the culture, religious feeling, and social values of the empire under which Jesus lived, died, and rose and Christianity was born? And what can these things tell us about what Christianity was, and maybe, could be today? Copies of this scholarly but accessible work are available in the office, and a PDF of each chapter will be included in that week's weekly email.

Excerpt from the Rotary newsletter....

The Art in the Parks program, sponsored by the Franklin Presbyterian Church, partnered for a third summer with Parks and Rec to bring weekly art activities to Franklin's youth.

Speaking to Rotarians at last week's meeting, Community Connections Coordinator for the Presbyterian Church, Bailey Pickens (right) expressed appreciation to the Rotary Club of Franklin for their support of this year's program through a Community Grant. Grant monies, she noted, allowed the group to purchase art supplies including the clay pictured above. Ms. Pickens explained that weekly art projects were offered by volunteers at three locations, Jim Roberts Community Park, Lincoln Park and the Housing Authority--all at no cost to the participants. Attendance surpassed that of previous years with a total of 210 for the summer.

This year's program concluded with an art show at the Cornerstone Building where young artists displayed their creative efforts for family members and friends to enjoy.



Session Highlights

AUGUST 19, 2024:

- ♦ Joyfully welcomed Tony Smith (son-in-law of Sylvia Pulliam, husband to Willis) as a new member at FPC by affirmation of faith and by baptism.
- Approved several updated policies for FPC including Child and Youth Protection Policy, Sexual Misconduct, Anti-Harassment, & Anti-Racism Policies, and the Benevolence Policy.
- Worked with Personnel recommendations to clarify duties for Pastor Bailey (including preaching and some pastoral duties) and an interim pastor during this time of transition at FPC
- Appointed trustees Bob Heidbrink and Keith Lawrence, partnership with trustees from The Presbyterian Church in Bowling Green for the Tom Moody estate.
- Welcomed Tim Leigh from Bowling Green as our liaison with the Western Kentucky Presbytery
 Committee on Ministry and as the moderator for Session in the near future, beginning in September.
- Approved Bailey Pickens to administer the Lord's Supper for the remainder of 2024.
- Approved up to \$5000 for repair of the sanctuary front door, the door across from the gazebo, the bell tower and frame and replacement of missing roof shingles.
- Approved the Personnel Committee as search committee for part-time interim.
- Approved disbursement of \$975 from Mustard Seed to help a vetted couple.
- Approve disbursement of \$500 from Christian Service nonlocal funds to Society of St. Andrew and request to congregation for additional donations.
- Approved \$2000 from Capital Funds for the purpose of sanctuary sound system repair.




