MAKING CONNECTIONS

Merry Christmas, friends. As this email arrives in your inbox, we will be halfway through the season of Christmas, looking forward to Epiphany, when we celebrate the magi finding the child Jesus and presenting him with their gifts. So we have received, and we are still seeking and expecting: This is the Christian life and we practice it in every season.

I mentioned last month that this lectionary year, Year C, is Luke's year, and Luke's two-volume gospel (Luke and Acts) was written with gentiles in mind. So the way Luke tells the story of Jesus and the early church is meant to show people who were *not* already expecting the Messiah, who didn't know to wait for good gifts from God, what God was like and who Jesus was for them, too. Luke reaches outward, and by following his account of Jesus' ministry this year we can learn how to reach outward in new ways, too. There are many who need a lot: Food, shelter, clothing, work, meaning, dignity, respect, love. How much we, as the church, are able to share for both the body and the spirit!

Room in the Inn is one way. January 1 begins our season, and we'll have nine chances this year to provide hospitality to Christ in the form of our homeless neighbors. If you haven't signed up yet, I hope you will. To return to Luke for just a moment: In speaking of Jesus the Messiah to the gentiles, Luke was inviting them into the sweep of salvation history recorded in the Jewish Scriptures, what we now call the Old Testament. That invitation is for us, too. So I want to invite you to that, too. Weekly Bible study will resume January 22nd, and we will be reading through the whole Bible, one bite at a time, and using it as a way to talk about our world, our God, and ourselves. Please come.

I can't wait to see what God will do in us in 2025.

The Matthew 25 Clothes Closet had a very successful 2024. More detailed data will be shared later in our annual report. But the numbers below are pretty impressive. Numbers in () are from 2023 and (()) from 2022.

People Served - 2938 (2390) ((1289)) Items Given Away - 20,231 (18,524) ((10,052))

In our Christmas Shop, we served 180 people and gave 449 gifts away. Our congregation's generosity is what made this possible. One member gave \$100 for us to spend as needed, so we were able to fill in areas where we didn't have enough. We actually will have quite a few toys to save for next year. A big thanks to Nancy Thomas who worked EVERY Tuesday and Thursday and to these people who worked one or more days: Sylvia Pulliam, Betsy Sheppard, Linda Knight, and Linda Lee.


