Pastor's Pen

The Fruits of Easter

The Easter season marks the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. There is a sense in which Easter is just as much about our lives today as resurrected people. Paul makes it clear that Jesus is the "first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Cor. 15:20).

That is a great analogy. Throughout history, people have brought the first fruits of the harvest as an offering to the Lord, both as an expression of thanksgiving ("Thank You, Lord, for the initial harvest) and of trust ("We trust You, Lord, to sustain us with the rest of the harvest").

We have been celebrating the Season of Green Lent. We understand that all of creation is waiting for resurrection and Jesus' death, and resurrection is the beginning of the end. He is the "first fruit" of God. Christ tells us over and over that the harvest is ready and all that is needed are workers to reap the harvest. We are the workers, and we have been adding chores to our list this Gren Lent season. We have learned to look for the sources of our food and the planting of native plants to sustain life.


Death entered the world through one Adam, and like an infection it spread to everyone and everything. But now, life has entered the world through Jesus, and new creation has turned the tide. Life is spreading to the world. The kingdom of God is here. Saint Augustine wrote:

"Man, indeed, brought death to himself and to the Son of Man. But the Son of Man, by dying and rising again, brought life to man."

So now, because of the resurrection of Jesus everything is turning around. The sun has pierced through the clouds of winter, and now, the first shoots of grass are popping up. The first sprouts are showing up on the trees and flowers. The world is coming alive.

Just as we see the initial signs of spring and know that the coming warmth will eventually overcome those last cold blasts of winter, just as we see the initial buds on a plant and know that the hills and trees and yards will remember green again, we look back to the resurrection and say: *This is the beginning of the end of death 's cruel, cold reign. This is the first fruit. There 's a harvest coming!*

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Approved up to \$3814 for renewing windows in the offices and the parlor (Remove paint, sand, clean, paint, caulk)
- Approved up to \$2410 for renewal of sanctuary windows
- Approved Certificate of transfer for Mary Jo Dreher to First Methodist church, Columbus, Mississippi
- Approved the use of the Cornerstone for a baking class by non-profit Banjo Bakes of Bowling Green. The class will be April 29.
- Approved the policy that cars may not be parked on FPC property for more than overnight. People will be informed that they may park their car to sleep overnight but must leave the next day.

Why I Joined the Living Waters for the World Franklin Team

Several years ago, I had the privilege of serving on the Earth Day Festival Committee. During that time, I met Don Halcomb, a member of Franklin Presbyterian Church. Don's excitement was contagious as he shared about his church's mission project to bring clean drinking water to communities in Guatemala. His passion sparked my curiosity, and desire to help.

Water has always been my beverage of choice. I consider it a privilege to have safe, clean water whenever I want to fill my glass. All those years ago, Don and Donna planted a seed in my heart—a desire to help bring this precious resource to those who aren't as fortunate. I firmly believe that access to safe drinking water is a right, not a privilege.

As the years passed, I still felt a strong pull toward this mission, but it wasn't yet my season to volunteer. Then, a few years later, Donna Houston spoke at the Rotary Club of Franklin about the Cup Bearer Program. As a single mother, traveling internationally wasn't feasible for me, and the \$1,200 training cost to participate seemed out of reach. But I was thrilled to learn that with just \$5 a month, I could contribute to providing clean drinking water to those in need. I signed up immediately.

One year ago, I realized that not only did I have the time to commit to traveling to Guatemala, but I had also saved enough to cover the training expenses. It was finally my season to serve in a hands-on way. I now look forward to volunteering alongside this powerhouse of beautiful, strong women who are making a difference—not only in our own lives by serving others, but in the lives of those who need clean water the most.
